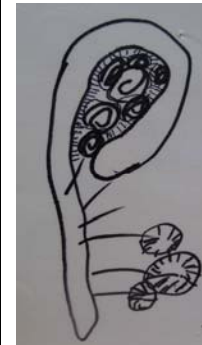

This quote encapsulates the challenges we face in reconceptualising the pedagogy of Reggio Emilia, and what this might mean in Aotearoa.

"The cultural knots that become apparent when observing another culture's interpretation of education can serve as a doorway into reconceptualising our own ideas of education. These knots are untidy complexities that emerge when differing cultural contexts intermingle. Can we make the gaze upon Reggio Emilia's educational experiences a cultural knot, rather than a mere replica? (Mardell, 2001, cited by Robertson, 2006 p.152).

THE KORU REPRESENTS OUR NEW BEGINNING: PRUE CRARER'S STORY

For weeks the children and I had been engaging in much discussion about the amazing trees and bush surrounding our centre and after using different languages to portray their interpretations(of what the trees meant to them personally), I began to see that these representational experiences became central to children's learning processes. Delving deeper and exploring and querying different emotions such as "Do trees have feelings?" a small group of children became fascinated with the koru. Upon investigating fern fronds in real form, all of different sizes, their study became intense and so following research on the internet and collaborating on their findings, these and many more exquisite koru drawings emerged from the children, using pen and ink. Further dialogue about new life, tenderness with regard to the delicate nature of the baby koru, and the incredible detail of the unfurling frond, became a focus. What followed were delicate, intricate representations of what the children observed, what they had come to understand and make meaning of, in their own unique way. What better way in which to celebrate these beautiful symbolic creations, than to use them in all of our documentation with regard to our REANZ organisation, where New Beginnings, Growth and Harmony stand at the very core of our vision.
